This double bottom line simply includes not losing money, while renovating and rehabbing rundown properties in the East and West Baltimore neighborhoods he grew up in. James joined Paradigm Homes

We asked James three questions on leadership and life goals. Read his responses below.

1. As you look back over your life, at what point did you begin to think of yourself as a leader?

At age 12, my mother almost succumbed to her surgery; This forced me to grow up really fast. I remember walking 5 blocks each way to make full market (complete our weekly grocery shopping) for me and my younger brother. I also had to wake myself up on time and travel using public transport from Baltimore City to Baltimore County and then back from Baltimore County to Baltimore City every day for months until my mother was able to resume her role as the head of our household. In retrospect, this was my introduction to leadership in a very real way. It taught me a value I've never forgotten since that time which is if you stay ready, you'll never have to worry about being ready. At age 14, my mother encouraged me to own a quality that I believe every leader has in their personal and professional character: Accountability. She did this by encouraging me to get a job if there were things I wanted beyond the scope of my needs instead of having an expectation for someone else to provide for me. I've been working ever since I was 14 years old and 1 month and I believe these lessons at ages 12 and 14 were the initial moments in my life that I began to think of myself as a leader. What I didn't' know at the time, was how my mother's example of leadership, even with modest means, in the years that preceded her surgery when I was 12, prepared me for the leadership opportunities that were ahead. Special thanks to my mother for being my first example of exceptional leadership.

2. <u>Do you have a vision that guides your body of work? If so, has it changed over time or remain</u> the same?

Absolutely! My vision that guides my body can be summed up by a personal mantra I live by: "Serving is a privilege and I do so at the pleasure of all who give me the opportunity to do so". Over the years, like many others, I've made Vision Boards, and Goal lists etc. It took me quite a few years to notice a pattern in the year over year unfulfilled items of interest as they related to the fulfilled items of interest. In 2013, I realized I was unbalanced almost to a fault. My professional interests were valued above my personal interests which can be summed up more simply by saying, I was never home with my children, although I was always out and about, busy doing something else I found meaningful. Fast-forwarding to the last five years, I've learned how to serve in harmony personally and professionally, and I'm blessed to take this skill and curate an experience for my clients that is memorable and balanced when they are building their dream home or embarking on their Custom Addition/Renovation project. Our clients are Our Family and I'm able to blend my personal and my professional family with the work that I do in the Custom Design-Build space. I'm grateful for this Win-Win opportunity.

3. <u>Does the work you do now play a part in the legacy you wish to leave behind? If not, describe</u> what tools you need to help you achieve your goals.

Yes, the work I do now plays a part in the legacy I wish to leave behind.
