



**Testimony on behalf of the Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce**

*In Opposition to  
Senate Bill 70—County Income Tax—Rate and Income Brackets--Alterations*

*January 15, 2025  
Senate Budget and Taxation Committee*

The Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce (GBCC) was founded in 1926. Since then, the organization has grown to more than 600 businesses located throughout the Greater Bethesda area and beyond. On behalf of these members, we appreciate the opportunity to provide written comments on Senate Bill 70—County Income Tax—Rate and Income Brackets--Alterations.

Senate Bill 70 would allow counties, if they choose to opt-in, to impose a higher maximum tax rate on an individual's Maryland taxable income, from 3.2% to 3.7%. Simply put, we are particularly concerned with measures, taxation and otherwise, that create or exacerbate disparities between Montgomery County and surrounding counties or Montgomery County and the state of Maryland with northern Virginia. Such a disparity is sure to have a negative impact on economic development efforts as it would make us less competitive with surrounding counties who do not adopt the higher tax rate and certainly with the state of Virginia, who we compete with for economic development dollars on a regular basis.

For these reasons, we would respectfully request a unfavorable vote on Senate Bill 70. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written comments.
